## Report of the West Muskerry A.C Macroom Bypass Run/Walk

Jons Civil Engineering-John Cradock JV were delighted to be able to provide an opportunity to West Muskerry AC to run a large scale fundraising event on the route of the new Macroom By-Pass Road before it opened to the public. The event itself was held on Sunday 27th November 2022 and proved to be a huge success, with between 2,500 and 3,000 people participating.

This is West Muskerry A.C's account of the occasion:

West Muskerry A.C. were raising funds for a new Sports hall on their training grounds in Ummera and had been told that the Contractor for the By-Pass might be interested in providing sponsorship towards the project as they have sponsored some local events in the past. We decided not to ask for sponsorship but instead ask to run a road race or a series of road races on the completed By-Pass.We sent in our proposal letter on the 24th of August 2021. As the road was progressing, we kept enquiring if this event would be possible.

When news broke that part of the By-Pass might be open before Christmas, we again enquired if our proposal would be possible. When we received the call three weeks ago that if we had our insurance in order with an indemnity to the contractor, Transport Infrastructure Ireland, and Cork County Council, it could be possible.

Once our insurance was sorted our Committee of Collette O`Riordan, Club Secretary, Sheila Daly, Treasurer, Jeremy Kelleher Vice Chairman, Brian O`Shea Chairman and Brighid Mullane Registrar had several meetings late into the night to draw up a plan, Risk Assessment and Medical Plan, organising stewards, booked Ambulances for



the day and first-aiders on bikes and make a list of what was needed on the day to make the event very special for everyone. A few trips on the By-Pass driven by Cole of Cork Co Council to work out distances, markers, and parking followed on.

The Pop-Up Races chip timing for the race was booked and we decided to look for some sponsors to help with the cost. Folláin, Cork County Council and Jons Civil Engineering/John Cradock/JV Ltd came on board. The supporting sponsors from Macroom supplied safety pins for numbers, bananas, water, cereal bars, sandwiches for stewards and we were confident all was going to fall into place.

It was an early, wet start to the morning, putting up tents, but it then dried up and from 10.30 to 4.30 we had a continuous stream of cars. It seemed as if the whole Community came out to support. The buzz was electric. All smiling and all meeting people they had not met since pre-covid and all delighted to get the chance to run/walk on the By-Pass.
